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USE THIS CHECKLIST TO PREPARE YOUR MATERIAL FOR CHIPPING
☐ Create Defensible Space up to 100 feet from structures and 30 feet from access roads.
Limbs must be less than 15-inches in diameter.
Piles must be hand stacked and be free of all roots, stumps, rocks and mud.
Cut ends must face the same direction and point the large end out, towards the chipper location.
Piles must be free of poison oak, Scotch or French broom after it seeds, blackberry, and other vines.
Piles must be located on the uphill side of the road or driveway.
The SFSC contractor cannot chip piles of leaves, pine needles, or light or wet yard clippings.
Piles must be within 5-feet of the chipper location and be less than 4-feet in height.
The SFSC contractors cannot chip commercial timber harvest debris or material from commercial orchards.
Piles must be free of all non-vegetative materials (trash, tarps, metal, wire, etc.).
Make sure you are done stacking and chipping at least three days before the scheduled chipping day.

Please make sure all the rules are followed. They exist because of Air Quality Management District requirements, contractor limitations, safety, and grant requirements. Failure to follow these rules will likely disqualify your pile from being chipped.


This photo shows a properly stacked pile. Correctly done, the limbs can be easily pulled from the top of the pile. The limbs must be hand fed into the chipper so your piles must be stacked by hand.

SHINGLETOWN FIRESAFE COUNCIL COMMUNITY CHIPPING PROGRAM



OVERVIEW



- Purpose: This program serves Shingletown along Highway 44 from 1 mile west of Dersch Rd. to Viola & from the Tehama County Line to halfway between 44 & Whitmore Rd. This program gives property owners a convenient, fire safe, & environmentally responsible way to dispose of defensible space trimmings. It reduces burning & smoke pollution while making disposal easy.
- Property owners may register any time, no need to wait for an announcement. We'll get to you.
- Piles can be built ahead of our chipping dates, but you should not submit your application until you are ready to be chipped. Piles will be inspected before the chipping date.

WHAT'S ACCEPTABLE



- Piles of woody branches & sticks
- Larger branches or small trees with a diameter of <10"
- Brush without roots or burls, like manzanita & buck brush
- Piles need to be stacked without machinery (too much dirt & entanglement), large ends towards where the chipper will be parked, within 5' of the chipper location, along the road or off a good driveway with a wide turnaround.
- Single pile size must not be larger than 5'x5'x5' but you can have multiple piles (this makes it easier & quicker for the crew, giving us more time for more properties)



WHAT'S NOT ALLOWED



- Machine created piles
- Construction debris
- Bags or piles of needles or leaves
- No trash
- No light vegetation like flowers (they don't chip)
- No dirt or stones or gravel (they damage our equipment)
- No blackberry vines, trip vines, or poison oak
- No pine cones
- No roots or burls
- No nails, wire, or metal objects
